Wave 1 Start Clinical Redesign

The 28 national first wave sites have moved into the collaborative phase of the programme. All 28 sites have achieved a minimum of level 3 on the *PBC Assessment Framework* and chosen their first PBC service areas to work on.

450 attended the first PBC learning workshop in May. Sixteen presentations of redesigned services from across the country were showcased in breakout sessions, and discussed in local team planning sessions.

Lord Warner, Minister for Health, joined the conference through a video link for question and answers. In addition, delegates were given a rare opportunity to

step into the shoes of a hospital NHS trust chief executive through an engaging presentation by Jim Easton, Chief Executive of York Hospitals Foundation Trust. Jim helped the whole audience to better understand how to negotiate with acute trusts in redesigning care.

Examples of clinical areas now being tackled by wave 1 sites include;

- A care pathway for Deep Vein Thrombosis in South Gloucestershire,
- Integrated clinical assessment services for gynaecology in primary care in South Manchester
- A PCT-wide clinical assessment service for minor surgery is being developed in Northamptonshire Heartlands
- Blackburn with Darwen are incrementally adding different treatments within a nurse-led minor injury service
- PBC clusters in Barking and Dagenham are working on COPD, developing a multidisciplinary team to avoid unnecessary hospital admissions and repatriate outpatient activity back into the community.

146 teams have now started work on wave 2 of the PBC development programme. PBC preparation training for the new recruits is being run at three venues in June and July (see *diary of dates* overleaf).

PCTs" Lord Warner, Minister of State for Reform

Speaking at the Public Service Reform Conference on 6th June, Lord Warner stressed the importance of PBC and said "I shall be making it clear to the new PCT Chairs and Chief Executives (as well as existing ones) that PBC is something that they need to support and is not negotiable for PCTs.

And there are some who claim they can not afford it and I give the same answer to them. The answer to those PCTs who claim that they cannot afford it is that they cannot afford not to do it!"

Three years on from PBC....

40 teams from across the country have sampled three years in a health economy under PBC. The one-day simulation events were run by Neil Wilson and his team and taken to London, Leicestershire and Yorkshire.

Neil Wilson, a former Department of Health advisor on Payment by Results, devised the simulation to give teams real practical experience of how PBC could work in a fast-paced local context.

PBC Policy Update

The service eagerly awaits the publication by the Department of Health of the commissioning framework in the summer. Policy development for PBC has been moving steadily since the publication of *Practice based commissioning: achieving universal coverage*, the DES for PBC and the key statement on budget setting in April. SHAs continue to send in monthly reports on PBC implementation.

The PBC team at DH are planning to publish in July an assessment of locally delivered information tools designed to support PBC. These will be available at: www.dh.gov.uk/practicebasedcommissioning
