## When to refer

•	Dysphagia (food sticking on swallowing) at any age
	Dyspepsia at any age plus one or more of the following 'alarm' symptoms:
	<ul> <li>Weight loss</li> </ul>
	Proven anaemia
	Vomiting
•	Dyspepsia in a patient aged >55 years with at least one of the following 'high risk' features:
	Onset of dyspepsia less than one year ago
	Continuous symptoms since onset
•	Dyspepsia plus at least one of the following known risk factors:
	<ul> <li>Family history of Upper GI cancer in more than 2 first degree relatives</li> </ul>
	Barrett's oesophagus
	Pernicious anaemia
	Peptic ulcer surgery over 20 years ago
	Known dysplasia, atrophic gastritis, intestinal metaplasia
•	Jaundice
•	Upper abdominal mass

if the patient does not meet the referral criteria above consider referral to CAS requesting a RARC appointment.
