- Haematological cancer suspected

When to refer

•	tients with a suspected haematological cancer/leukaemia must see a specialist within two weeks of GP deciding that they need to be seen urgently
Urgent out-patient referral [liaise with specialist and copy to CAS]	
•	Blood count/film reported as suggestive of acute leukaemia or chronic myeloid leukaemia.
•	Lymphadenopathy (greater than 1 cm) persisting for 6 weeks.
•	Hepatosplenomegaly.
•	Bone pain associated with anaemia and a raised ESR (or plasma viscosity).

Bone X-rays reported as being suggestive of myeloma.

Constellation of 3 or more of the following symptoms:

- Fatigue
- Night sweats
- Weight loss
- Itching
- Breathlessness
- Bruising
- Recurrent infections
- Bone pain

Refer to RARC

if the patient does not meet the referral criteria above consider referral to CAS requesting a RARC appointment.
